

SWORN COMPLAINT BEFORE THE TEXAS ETHICS COMMISSION

An individual must be a resident of the state of Texas to be eligible to file a sworn complaint with the Texas Ethics Commission. The complainant is required to attach to the complaint a copy of one of the following documents:

- complainant's driver's license or personal identification certificate issued under Chapter 521 of the Transportation Code, or commercial driver's license issued under Chapter 522 of the Transportation Code; or
- a utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows the name and address of the complainant and is dated not more than 30 days before the date on which the complaint is filed.

Effective September 1, 2009, an individual may also be eligible to file a sworn complaint with the Texas Ethics Commission if the individual owns real property in the state of Texas. Under this provision, the complainant will be required to attach to the complaint a copy of a property tax bill, notice of appraised value, or other government document that shows the name of the complainant, shows the address of the real property in Texas, and identifies the complainant as the owner of the real property.

III. NATURE OF ALLEGED VIOLATION

By virtue of this complaint, I am alleging that Ms. Alice Linahan has violated Chapter 305 of the Government Code that addresses whether an individual must register as a lobbyist in Texas by virtue of certain activities.

I am in no way trying to discourage individuals from being active and engaged in the policy-making process, but when that engagement crosses over into professional paid advocacy, there are certain laws, rules and requirements that come into play in order to provide transparency and accountability for all concerned.

Rather than express concerns about Ms. Linahan's activities in public or on the Internet, I am pursuing the appropriate legal remedies for this concern.

IV. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- She hosted a June 6 podcast with Senator Dan Patrick regarding CSCOPE. (1)
- On July 18th, Senator Dan Patrick sent a letter to State Auditor, John Keel, requesting an audit of CSCOPE. (2)
- She hosted a July 22nd podcast with Lt. Governor David Dewhurst regarding CSCOPE and the request of an audit by the Texas State Auditor's office. (3)
- On July 24th, Senator Dan Patrick filed SB 41 that would have prohibited any public school from using the CSCOPE curriculum. (4)
- She participated at a press conference in the Senate Press Room on August 12th with Lt. Governor David Dewhurst and Representative Steve Toth. She requested the use of this room from the Lt. Governor's office. Rep. Toth was the House sponsor of CSCOPE-related legislation during the 2013 Session. (5)
- She attended an August 16th court hearing in Llano, Texas regarding the temporary restraining order of the CSCOPE curriculum for Llano ISD. Senator Dan Patrick was also in attendance. This hearing was the subject of the press conference on August 12th listed above.
- August 23rd, Lt. Governor Dewhurst issues a press release thanking John Keel, the Texas State Auditor, for agreeing to do an audit of CSCOPE. (6)

- She attended an August 24th CSCOPE debate between Senator Dan Patrick and myself. She appeared with stacks of t-shirts and a 6-foot color sign opposing CSCOPE. (7)
- On her registration form to provide public testimony at the September 13th SBOE hearing on CSCOPE, she listed that she was not appearing as an individual, but on behalf of an affiliation with Women on the Wall. (8)
- She posted on Facebook on September 13th where she indicated she put 30,000 miles on her car in the past 9 months working to stop CSCOPE. (9)
- She met with officials from the Governor's office regarding CSCOPE on September 10th with other anti-CSCOPE participants. Ginger Russell was also in attendance. (10)
- She hosted a meeting in Mount Pleasant, Texas on September 14th where she brought in speakers from around the state, and another from Washington D.C., and charged attendees \$20. (11)
- Voices Empower is clearly an organization for hire (12)

These issues, combined with the fact that Mrs. Linahan is the founder of Voices Empower (<http://www.voicesempower.com/about/>) lead to the reasonable conclusion that she is being compensated for the above-listed activity on behalf of her client and, just as she indicated on her witness registration form, she is not doing the above-listed activities merely as an "individual" citizen.

I have not been able to determine who her client is, or if her compensation exceeds the statutory threshold for lobbying or preparing to lobby since she has not publicly disclosed her client or compensation related to this issue.

There is "Women on the Wall" branding on much of her collateral, but it is unclear what her role is with that organization or the relationship between Women on the Wall and Voices Empower.

Given the amount of activity, \$1,000 seems like a very low estimate of her compensation for communicating and preparing to communicate with state officials. Furthermore, given the amount of activity, it seems clear that she spends more than a de minimis amount of time on these activities.

State Sen. Dan Patrick seeks audit of CSCOPE

AUSTIN— On Thursday, State Sen. Dan Patrick sent a letter to State Auditor John Keel asking for his review of the operations of the TESCCC, governing board of the CSCOPE program. This letter follows a similar letter submitted to the State Auditor by the Office of the Attorney General last week.

“While my initial concerns with CSCOPE focused on the content of their lesson plans,” said Patrick, “further review revealed that CSCOPE had potential underlying legal issues that need to be addressed.”

Among the concerns outlined in his letter to State Auditor John Keel are the facts that the Education Service Centers failed to comply with state law requiring a bidding process and the adoption of formal contracts with state government vendors.

In part, the letter reads:

“In light of these issues, I am writing to ask you to exercise your authority as State Auditor and determine if the Education Services Centers acted appropriately under state law when they paid NER to produce the CSCOPE materials without a bidding process and without the protections of a legally binding contract.”

“Texans deserve an open and transparent state government and that is particularly true of our public education system,” said Patrick. “The curriculum in our classrooms must be open to public scrutiny as well as the contracts to publish them.”

In response to TEA’s suggestion to the SBOE that CSCOPE lesson plans could be used because they are in the public domain, Senator Patrick said, “I disagree with that analysis but I am looking into the issue further. Until I started asking questions, and holding hearings, parents weren’t even allowed to view these materials.”

“Until this question is resolved, parents need to continue to make their voices heard at the local school district level that they want CSCOPE out of their schools.”

“The vast majority of parents, teachers, and legislators have made it clear they want CSCOPE out of their schools. I stand with them and intend to make sure no one tries to slide CSCOPE lesson plans under the classroom door,” said Patrick.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the use by a school district or district employee of certain existing student curriculum materials developed or provided by a regional education service center.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 8, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 8.0532 to read as follows:

Sec. 8.0532. PROHIBITION ON SCHOOL DISTRICT USE OF CURRICULUM.
Notwithstanding any other provision of this subchapter, a school district may not use or authorize its teachers or employees to use student curriculum products developed or provided before August 31, 2013, by a regional education service center acting in collaboration with one or more other regional education service centers.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the legislative session.

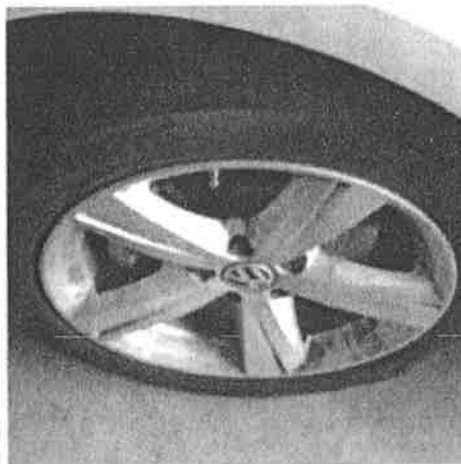
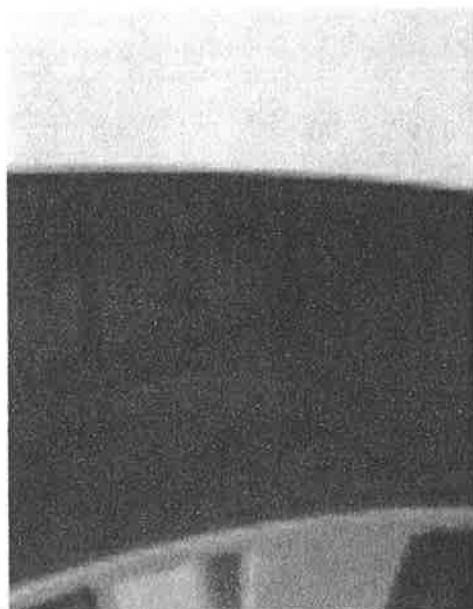

CSCOPE foe to speak Friday at hearing in Austin

Montgomery County CSCOPE activist Ginger Russell will speak at a public hearing Friday in Austin regarding CSCOPE Social Studies lesson plans that are being reviewed by the State Board of Education's (SBOE) Ad Hoc Review Committee.

Russell said she has been fighting the use of the set of courses in Texas schools and exposing the philosophy behind it for some time.

CSCOPE is a curriculum management system created by Texas Education Service Centers with assistance from content experts. It is now used in 875 public school districts, charter schools and private schools in Texas, which educate 34 percent of the state's total student population, according to the Texas Education Agency's website.

Neither the SBOE nor the Texas Education Agency were involved in the development of CSCOPE.

However, because of concerns raised by parents and educators about CSCOPE, Barbara Cargill, chair of the State Board of Education, at the behest of the Senate Education Committee chair, appointed an ad hoc committee to review CSCOPE content.

The chair's ad hoc committee appointed review panels to examine the CSCOPE instructional content, beginning with social studies.

A public process solicited nominations for the review panels composed of parents, educators, curriculum specialists, business professionals and other stakeholders, according to the TEA website.

Russell's website, Red Hot Conservative, posted a dozen CSCOPE tests and answer keys last week.

"I have been fighting this from the beginning," Russell said. "The education establishment has deceived taxpayers and parents for years by hiding this curriculum. The money aspect is a huge concern and is now under review of the attorney general and the state auditor," she said.

According to Russell, Willis ISD is the only district in Montgomery County that partakes of CSCOPE.

"Our teachers work in Professional Learning Communities to create their own lesson plans. CSCOPE is one of many resources used by the teachers," WISD Communications Director Erin Kleineke said.

Texas Education Commissioner Michael Williams sent Texas school districts a legal advisory letter Monday reminding them that they must hold public meetings in order to adopt any curriculum provider, including online lesson plan provider CSCOPE, according to the Texas Education Agency.

Williams said his letter is not meant to discourage use of CSCOPE, only to point out the law under SB 1474, which requires a public meeting about a district's choice in curriculum. Williams said this step

creates local control and transparency.

Russell said she is in the heat of the battle.

"I meet with Gov. Perry's education staff Tuesday and speak before the State Board of Education Friday, then to Mt. Pleasant, Texas, to speak at an Education Summit. (It's) a lot of travel," Russell said.

"America will not survive this type of indoctrination. American sovereignty needs to be taught in the classroom."

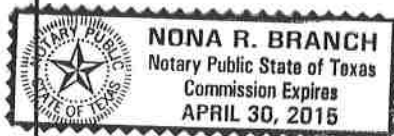

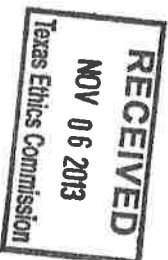

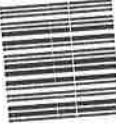
